

#### **Good News Reflection**

# Faith that Gives Hope and Victory

Today's world needs Christians who truly understand that faith gives us hope and victory in the midst of any and all difficulties.



Taking this even further, today's world needs Catholics who truly understand that going to Mass means having faith in miracles – especially the miraculous transformation of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. Are you changed by the presence of Christ in the Eucharist? If so, then after you exit the church, others see evidence of this faith – right?

There's a difference between "knowing" the truths of our faith and authentically living these truths.

What prayer requests have you made in which you're still waiting for God to provide his help? When you offer them to Jesus during the prayers of Mass, do you feel the hopefulness that comes from faith?

During the consecration of the Eucharist, if we do not have faith in God's ability to change bread and wine into Christ – an ability that does not rely on how holy the priest is – we won't have faith to recognize that Jesus is ministering to us in the Eucharist.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus speaks of his Second Coming, but we can also relate it to our daily lives today. We all have new tribulations looming in the future, unknown and unpredictable. That's life on earth! And Jesus wants to help us through them. Faith in this gives us hope and victory.

However, when our focus is on our troubles instead of on Christ, we are not living in faith. Jesus warned us about our hearts becoming spiritually drowsy. This is when we lose faith. We forget to remain centered in Christ. We neglect to listen for the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

But when we ask Jesus to restore us to a life of faith, we become vigilant, expectant, and aware that we can rely on God to help us in whatever comes our way.

Our tribulations makes us fearful. Faith gives us reasons to hope in Jesus and to live in joy instead of fear. It's not easy! It takes conscious effort. But spiritual drowsiness is a miserable way to live.

**Questions for Personal Reflection:** What are you waiting for from Jesus? How will you use the Season of Advent to grow in faith by noticing the loving, generous, merciful activities of God?

**Questions for Community Faith Sharing:** What are your favorite ways to prepare for Christmas? How do you make Advent a season of hope and a time of growing in faith?

**Pray:** Lord Jesus, awaken our hearts to Your presence in the Eucharist. Strengthen our faith to embrace hope and victory over life's trials. As we journey through Advent, help us to live joyfully, trusting in Your love and guidance, and sharing Your light with others. Amen.




WEEK ONE – Introduction – Promise of a Ruler Scripture: Jeremiah 33:14-16

In this week we will introduce the concept of the series. Christmas is a time of promise and high expectations for gifts and family time and fond memories for the future. Not every Christmas fulfills those expectations. Beyond the promises our world offers for Christmas, God offers us a promise as well. He offers the promise of a ruler who will bring stability and strength to the land.

God promises to send his Son into our lives to bring stability to our hearts when we enthrone Jesus in our hearts, we can weather any storm that comes our way. Christmas is about God's promise of Jesus, a ruler who brings stability and peace to our hearts, not just worldly expectations.

As you already know, at Assumption, we preach in message series. Over several weeks, we will examine a topic in depth. We select a topic based on the weekend's scripture readings.

God speaks to us at every moment, especially in a community setting, when His people come together on Sundays

and listen to the Word of God as we celebrate, pray, praise, and thank God. Then the discussion continues in the Small Groups and goes deeper. Our message series usually runs from September to July. Our mission continues to Love God, Serve Others, and Grow Disciples.

#### Financial Report: September 2023 through August 2024



It is my responsibility to make sure that the parish remains up to date on our financial situation so, below is our parish's financial report from our last fiscal year ended August 31, 2024. I've divided income and expenses into recognizable categories, to help give a clearer idea of where the money comes from and where it went. Income and expense items have been divided into 4 categories, Parish Office, Faith Formation, Church, and Rectory. Expenses that applied to all areas were proportionately distributed based upon a percentage of the total activity.

The goal, of course, is to have our operating income cover our operating expenses, without needing to use our savings. With the parish's help, we were blessed to accomplish this goal for this fiscal year. As you can see from the Income/Expense chart below, we were close to breakeven which was

due to a 4% increase in our collections, while our expenses in most areas either decreased or stayed consistent. To understand how much we spend just to keep the doors open, here are a couple of our total annual bills: Gas \$17,840; electric \$16,283; water \$2,030; insurance \$56,698; grounds \$43,537. Our biggest investment is in our children as we continue to expand our Faith Formation and Sprouts programs while growing our students and families..

For the parish to thrive, we must continue growing as disciples who embrace the STEPS of Discipleship: Serve, Tithe, Engage, Prayer and Sacraments, and Share. Thankfully, our online giving portion of collections has continued to increase over the past year since it is a great way of improving and stabilizing our financial situation. Getting more families to participate in Faith Direct, our parish's electronic giving program, is a great way to "take a step" toward a stewardship way of life. I use this for my own weekly parish offering.

Together we rely on God's abundance. I remain convinced that the Lord is much more prepared for us than we are receiving. Below is the Income/Expense chart that summarizes where we have been over the past fiscal year.
